Leadership opportunities have started for our grade 5 students! Student leaders have been enjoying their time as lunch monitors and crossing guards! Thank you to Ms. Walker & Mrs. McDonnell for organizing the lunch monitors, and thank you to Mrs. Rothwell for organizing and training our crossing guards! FEEDING FUTURES FOOD PROGRAM


The ministry has provided school districts with funding to support food programs for students who are in need during the school day (options and availability will vary from school to school).

Due to gym capacity, 2 guests/ student from performing classes may attend the assembly.


